**WINTER MAINTENANCE BY-LAW
OVERNIGHT PARKING
BY-LAW 30662**

In accordance with Provincial Statutes, the former City of North York approved a By-law to regulate the overnight parking of motor vehicles on all public highways within the jurisdiction of the Corporation:

**NO PARKING ON CITY STREETS
2:00 A.M. TO 6:00 A.M.
DECEMBER 1ST TO MARCH 31ST**

This By-law takes precedence over all other on-street regulations, when in effect.

This By-law is intended to help facilitate winter maintenance and the owner of any motor vehicle parked in contravention of this By-law is subject to a penalty of \$30.00 (thirty dollars).

As with all parking infractions, a vehicle parked in contravention is subject to a tag and/or towing.

This winter it will be easier to drive in the former City of North York without being hindered by roads blocked with snow. Many residents are not able to get in or out of their driveways because snowplows were not able to complete their work due to parked vehicles on the street.

The former City of North York Council has taken steps to eliminate this from occurring, with the approval of a by-law to prohibit parking on all streets under its jurisdiction between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., from December 1st of each year up to and including March 31st of the following year.

This by-law was enacted as a result of numerous complaints received throughout the winter from residents irritated by the fact that parked vehicles hindered snowplowing.

In the former City of North York, as in most communities, after a snow fall, residential streets are usually plowed in the early morning hours. This is also the time when many motorists park their second or third vehicle on the street. Now, vehicles parked in contravention of this by-law are subject to a fine and/or towing.

As this by-law is unique to the former City of North York, Council undertook a Private Member's Bill at the Provincial Legislature in order to consolidate the authority of the by-law. This Bill was presented to the Legislature by a former City of North York Council Member. The Bill received Royal assent on May 24, 1988 and was enacted as a By-law on September 19, 1988.
